

Light Work Permitted for Minors¹

Regulation no. 93 of 11 June 2009 of the Government of the Republic

The Regulation is established on the basis of subsection 7 (5) of the Employment Contracts Act.

§ 1. Light work

(1) It is permitted for minors of 13-14 years of age or minors of 15-16 years of age who are obliged to attend school to perform, above all, the following light work:

- 1) agricultural work, such as planting, weeding, watering or hilling of horticultural or arable crop, harvesting, picking berries or fruit, cleaning or preparing for sale of vegetables;
- 2) support work performed in trading or service enterprises, such as unpacking or placing of goods on shelves, sticking of price stickers or labels, preparing of packaging material or packaging, packing of small objects, distributing of promotional samples or promotional printed matter;
- 3) support work performed in catering or accommodation establishments, such as laying tables, cleaning up or washing of tableware, cleaning of rooms;
- 4) manufacturing handicraft such as souvenirs or helping to sell them;
- 5) collecting, drying or packaging of medicinal plants;
- 6) work in an office, including work with a display screen;
- 7) cleaning or tidying work;
- 8) greening work;
- 9) work specified in subsection 2.

(2) It is permitted for minors of 7-12 years of age to perform light work in the fields of culture, art, sports or advertising, above all taking part in the work of a performing arts institution as persons engaged in creative activities and work as a model.

§ 2. Entry into force of Regulation

The Regulation shall enter into force on 1 July 2009.
